

Childhood Trauma and the Impact of Incarceration

◆ Incarcerating Families

- Incarceration in the home is considered an Adverse Childhood Event (ACE) that can deeply affect a child and their well-being. This component discusses the impact of incarceration from arrest to visitation through release and re-entry to the family. Each step can disrupt a child's physical, emotional, and cognitive health that can reflect in the classroom. This session discusses how to work with children and families to ensure the best emotional and academic outcomes for the child.

◆ Juvenile Incarceration

- In this session we discuss the prevalence of juvenile incarceration, the emotional implications, as well as the interruption to academic success for these children. This session also takes time to discuss re-entry into the school environment after incarceration and tools to assist the child ease this transition and get back on track for success.

◆ An Introduction to Restorative Justice and Classroom Restorative Practices

- This session introduces the concept of the school to prison pipeline, the historic effects of "no tolerance" policies, as well as an introduction in restorative justice and practices. This session will help school staff better understand ways to improve both classroom and administrative discipline protocol. The session will also provide practical tools that educators and other school staff can use to turn classroom discipline from just punitive to positive learning opportunities.



About the Trainer

Melissa McClain is a graduate of Kent State University and is the Community Education Program Coordinator at Akron Children's Hospital. She is responsible for a social and emotional learning curriculum that includes k-12 classroom education as well as psychological trauma education for educators and other professionals who work in a school environment. Since 2006, Melissa has educated over 68,000 students, school staff and community members. She has worked with over 150 Ohio school buildings and community organizations that work with youth and has also been lucky to travel to speak for state and national audiences on teen dating, emotional literacy, bullying, and psychological trauma.
